KADUNA STATE UNIVERSITY STOOD STILL AS PROF. HELEN AFANG ANDOW IS HONOURED WITH A TWO-VOLUME FESTSCHRIFT CELEBRATING HER DISTINGUISHED SCHOLARSHIP AND SERVICE



Kaduna State University (KASU) witnessed an atmosphere of celebration, pride, and scholarly reverence as the institution hosted the formal launch of a two-volume Festschrift in honour of Professor Helen Afang Andow, the Deputy Vice Chancellor, Strategy, Innovation and Service Delivery. The event, held at the 1000-Seater Auditorium, drew an impressive assembly of academics, public officials, colleagues, family members, and well-wishers, an unmistakable testament to her towering influence within and beyond the university community.
