NAAT COMMENDS KADUNA STATE GOVERNMENT OVER PAYMENT OF OUTSTANDING SALARIES, ALLOWANCES



Khe Kaduna State Government has been commended for its commitment to staff welfare following the payment of outstanding salaries and allowances owed members of the National Association of Academic Technologists (NAAT) at Kaduna State University (KASU).

This commendation came when delegates of NAAT paid a courtesy visit to the Vice Chancellor of Kaduna State University, Prof. Abdullahi Ibrahim Musa, ahead of the forthcoming Northwest Zonal Meeting of the association, which KASU will host.
