KASU DEPARTMENT OF LIBRARY AND INFORMATION SCIENCE WELCOMES 100 NEW STUDENTS



The Department of Library and Information Science at Kaduna State University has formally welcomed about 100 newly admitted students during an orientation programme held at the university's Multipurpose Lecture Hall.

The event, designed to introduce the students to academic expectations and campus support systems, was attended by key members of the university community. The Vice Chancellor was represented by Yusha'u Ibrahim Ango, the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academic), alongside the University Librarian, Babangida Umar Dangani, the Dean of Student Affairs M. K. Dauda, and the Dean of the Faculty of Social Sciences (represented). Also present were representatives of the Chief Security Officer and the Director of the Medical Centre, members of the Faculty of Allied Health Sciences, as well as Usman Ahmed Adam, Head of Department, Library and Information Science, and staff of the department.

Delivering the welcome address, the Deputy University Librarian urged the students to take advantage of the university's academic resources and opportunities. Dr. Usman Ahmed Adam, Head of Department, Library and Information Science, provided an overview of the programme structure and outlined departmental expectations, emphasizing discipline, commitment to study, and adherence to academic regulations.
