The Vice Chancellor of Kaduna State University, Professor Abdullahi Ibrahim Musa, has advised the leadership of the Medical Students' Association to remain focused on their academic responsibilities while demonstrating dedication and accountability in managing the affairs of the association.

The Vice Chancellor gave the advice through the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Strategy, Innovation and Service Delivery), Professor Helen Afang Andow, when she received newly elected officials of the association during a courtesy visit to the university management.

Professor Andow noted that the university's strategic plan prioritises student-centred initiatives and community engagement, among others, encouraging the association to align its activities with these goals. She assured the students that their requests would be conveyed to the management and urged them to remain committed to their programmes.

The Deputy Vice Chancellor also commended the association's community service efforts and advised its leadership to work closely with the university's Corporate Services Department to strengthen the visibility of their activities.

Earlier, the President of the association, Faisal Salis, said the visit was aimed at formally introducing the new executives to the university leadership, seeking institutional support, and presenting the association's past activities, particularly its community health outreach initiatives.
