KADUNA STATE UNIVERSITY SEEKS WIDER STUDENT REGISTRATION ON NERD AS OVER 2,000 GRADUATES SET FOR NATIONAL YOUTH SERVICE CORPS MOBILISATION

Kaduna State University is seeking greater participation of students in registering with the Nigeria Education Repository Data Bank as part of efforts to strengthen educational data management and student visibility at the national level.

Students expected to complete the registration include those in diploma programmes, undergraduate degree programmes, postgraduate Masters, PhD, and part-time studies. The university is already captured on the NERD website, creating an opportunity for students to benefit from the platform.

In an interview, Student Affairs Officer and NERD Record Officer Garba Dangiwa Yahaya assured stakeholders that participation in the NERD registration exercise is a win-win development for the university, students, and the wider education sector. He noted that the process will improve records management, verification, and access to academic information.

In separate interviews, Farida Ahmed Goje and Muhammad Ibrahim of the Sociology Department described the registration process with the Nigeria Education Repository Data Bank as seamless, and encouraged other students to key into the initiative.

Meanwhile, Kaduna State University has achieved full mobilisation for Batch A Stream One and Two of the National Youth Service Corps programme.

More than two thousand prospective corps members from the 2018, 2019, and 2020 sets are expected to report to orientation camps for the commencement of the exercise.

Looking ahead, preparation of the Batch B Stream One list is already underway, with eligible graduates expected to be called up in June this year for the National Youth Service Corps scheme.
