

STUDENTS AFFAIRS DIVISION RAISES RED FLAG AGAINST EXAMINATION MISCONDUCT

Concerns over examination misconduct took center stage on Kaduna State University's campus radio, KASU FM, as student affairs officials intensified efforts to educate students on institutional rules and consequences of violations.

In the latest edition of Issues on Campus, a program dedicated to student-focused discussions, Mrs. Comfort Rafael Afui, a counsellor in the Students Affairs Division, joined host Fedelix Asinde of the Mass Communication Department to address the growing issue of examination malpractice. The session, which built on last week's discussion, focused on defining misconduct, outlining institutional regulations, and clarifying disciplinary measures.

Mrs. Afui emphasized that examination misconduct remains a serious offence under university regulations, warning that penalties imposed by the institution's senate or management can be severe. She explained that such sanctions are designed not only to punish offenders but also to uphold academic integrity and deter future violations.

"The university has clear rules guiding examinations, and any breach attracts consequences that may affect a student's academic journey," she noted, urging students to familiarize themselves with these regulations.

The program also reinforced promoting awareness among students about institutional policies and behavioural expectations.

Further insights into student welfare were shared during an interactive session featuring key officials from the Students Affairs Division, including Deputy Registrar Mrs. Florence Sulaiman, Senior Assistant Registrar Halima Mu'azu Yeshu'a, and Senior Counselling Psychologist Dr. Yohanna Samuel Achi. Mrs. Florence highlighted the division's multifaceted role in addressing student needs beyond academics.
